


In the autumn semester 2019, Studio Sergison continued its long-term study of Zurich. Over the course of six semesters we aim to produce an urban plan for Zurich as the cumulative result of six separate studies. In this instance we have focused on the Unterstrass, Wipkingen and Höngg areas of Zurich.

the Unterstrass, Wipkingen and Höngg areas of Zurich. Several years ago the Department of Urbanism and Architecture for the municipality of Zurich announced that the future development of the city would prioritise densification within the existing urban area and limit the expansion of building on agricultural land. In other words, a denser, more compact urban growth would be promoted. For a city that is so well served by public transport, has a refined public realm and generally experienced well planned urban growth in the past, this ambition seems a logical response to the need for the city to absorb a growing population and deal with the pressures this exerts on housing and other public services.

This is the context in which the projects contained in the document were developed. Students have considered the parts of the city we focused over the semester, and the projects that have emerged offer concrete proposals for various sites, based on current buildings regulations and heritage status constraints. An accompanying strategy plan for Unterstrass, Wipkingen and Höngg developed collectively by the students is illustrated in an accompanying document.
