This semester, for the first time, we worked on housing projects in Kyoto, Japan within the framework of an exchange between the Kyoto Institute of Technology and the Academy of Architecture, Mendrisio.

Students from each architecture school worked in pairs with students from the other, and spent the first four weeks of the semester in Kyoto and the remainder in Mendrisio.

The focus of our work was housing, and we endeavoured to find solutions to the needs of contemporary Japanese society. Specifically, we selected 12 neighbourhoods to be studied in detail.

While in Japan, we visited exemplars of Japanese housing, and our work was supported by experts who offered insights into the issues we addressed.
